Residency Requirement

The University's residency requirement is that all unmarried, full-time undergraduate students must reside in University housing during their first two years of enrollment unless they are at least 21 years of age or are living with their parents/guardians in their primary family homes that are within a 50 mile radius of the University's campus.



First Year Residence Hall

- Loughran Hall
- Capacity: 328 first-year students
- Could have both single-sex and co-ed floors
- 8 RAs throughout and supervised by a graduate-level Residence Director
- Single available (limited), Doubles, Triples (limited), and Quads
- Suite-style rooms (no more than 4 students share a bathroom)
- Air-conditioning
- Laundry facilities with new washers and dryers, study lounges, and public microwaves provided on each floor
- Student Health Services, 24-Hour Study Lounge located in the main lobby area
- Front desk staffed by Campus Safety 24/7



Housing Costs: Loughran Hall

Room Type	Per Semester	Per Year
Multiple Occupancy (Doubles, Triples, Quads)	\$4,069	\$8,138
Single Occupancy	\$4,983	\$9,966

- **Marywood University does not view that one room type is better than another.**



First- Year Meal Plans

All first- year students living on-campus are required to choose one of the following meal plan options:

Meal Plan	Cost Per Semester	Cost Per Year
19 Meals Per Week with \$200 in Dining Dollars	\$3,100	\$6,200
15 Meals Per Week with \$300 in Dining Dollars	\$3,100	\$6,200

- **Dining Dollars do not carry over from semester to semester**
- **Students may change their meal plan within the first two weeks of each semester.**

Student Room Placements

What to do in order to secure housing (due Saturday, July 17th):

1. Complete the 2021-2022 Undergraduate Housing & Dining Agreement and Preference Form (www.marywood.edu/housingform)
 2. Submit a \$300 housing deposit to Admissions
- Students are welcome to submit housing preferences and roommate requests however, they are not guaranteed! Only mutual requests will be considered.
 - In lieu of roommate requests, students will be paired based on information submitted on the Undergraduate Housing and Dining Agreement and Preference Form.
 - Placements will be emailed to the student's Marywood email address no later than **August 9th.**



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New Student Move-In Information

Check-in for new First-Year (Freshmen) and Transfer students will be held on **Saturday, August 21st, from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.**

Student Health Services requirements for all residential students:

- Completed Health History, Physical, and Immunization Record (can be completed via the Student Health portal at <http://www.marywood.edu/healthservices/index.html>)
- Compliance information that you have either received the meningitis vaccine or signed an informed consent waiver (state law)
- A negative COVID-19 test result 3-5 days prior to your scheduled move-in date or proof of vaccination (to be uploaded to Student Health portal)



New Student Move-In Information

- Pack carefully! In most cases, you are sharing a room with at least one other individual who also needs equal access to the room. Plan to bring just the necessities at first and adjust during the year.
- When you check into your room you will be asked to verify the condition of your room via a Room Condition Form (RCF). You will be asked to identify any existing conditions in the room such as paint chips, marks on the walls, etc.
- Please do this carefully as another assessment will be conducted at the end of the year and charges may be applied for any differences in room condition.

Student Bills

- If you have not received a copy of your student bill, you may check your MarywoodYOU portal or request a copy at the Cashier's Office (Liberal Arts Center, room 87)
- On every first-year student's bill, you will notice the following 2 items:
 1. **Housing Placeholder (HPH):** this is a placeholder for the student's assigned room. The price of this placeholder is equivalent to the cost of a Loughran Hall multiple occupancy room. Once housing assignments are made, this item will be replaced with the student's actual room assignment (early August).
 2. **Meal Plan (15 Meals Per Week):** This is a default meal plan that is placed on students' accounts prior to us receiving students' housing forms. This meal plan will be adjusted according to the preference indicated on the student's housing form in early August.
- Student bills are **not** final- your bill could change depending on location of placement and room type (single or multiple occupancy).



Policies & Procedures

- All policies and procedures can be found online in the Student Handbook. **It is the student's responsibility to read and understand all policies outlined in the handbook.** Policies and procedures will be further discussed with residential students move-in weekend.
- **Dry Residential Areas:** alcohol and drugs are NOT permitted
- **Smoke-Free Campus:** Smoking, any use of tobacco products, and other smoking-related products of any kind are prohibited on all Marywood University property
- **Visitation:** University housing facilities are open only to Marywood University residents and staff. Commuter students and outside visitors are NOT permitted in the residential areas at this time.

Guidelines for all residential student guests:

1. Be escorted at all times by a resident host.
2. Sign-in and register with a photo ID upon entering the building and sign-out upon departure of the residence hall.
3. Enter the building through the main entrance
4. Follow the visitation hours for your residential area.



Prohibited Items

- Free standing microwave ovens
- Extension cord (only those with a surge protector are permitted)
- Multi-plug adaptors
- Candles
- Incense
- Pets other than fish (tanks must be 10 gallons or less)
- Air conditioners
- Space heaters
- Wax Warmers/Melters
- Toasters/Toaster Ovens
- Any item with exposed heating coils
- Crock pots
- Rice cookers
- Hot plates
- Electric skillets/grills
- Halogen bulbs
- Multi-bulb lamps
- Any use of tobacco products, and other smoking related products (including vape devices and e-cigarettes) are prohibited.
- Nails/Tacks/Wall-damaging adhesives
- Clings that block entire window
- Items hung from or attached to the ceiling
- Alcohol or alcohol paraphernalia (includes any containers or glasses associated with alcohol)
- Wireless routers
- String lights, including holiday lights (both plug-in and battery operated)
- Hoverboards, Swagways, or similar

If any of the items above are found within the residential area, they will be confiscated and conduct and/or monetary charges may be applied.



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Suggested Items

- Extra sheets (Twin XL)
- Mattress pad/cover
- Egg-crate mattress
- Pillows
- Alarm clock
- Storage containers
- **Alcohol-based sanitizer**
- **Cleaning supplies (disinfectant wipes, toilet brush, etc.)**
- Bath towels, hand towels, washcloths
- Shower caddy
- Bathroom organizer
- **Hand-soap pump**
- Shower mat
- Shower curtain with rings
- Sunscreen
- Hot pot/ Coffee pot (Keurigs & Auto-Shutoff coffee makers)
- Energy-rated refrigerator- 3 amps or less
- Laptop/PC
- Printer, Ink, and paper
- Ethernet cord
- Television
- Power strip (MUST include a surge protector)
- Desk items
- Desk lamp (not multi-bulb)
- Clothing
- Laundry bag and detergent
- Hangers
- Iron and Ironing Board
- Backpack or Tote bag
- Painter's Tape (acceptable to use to hang items on the wall)
- Waste basket
- Throw Rug
- **Tissues**
- Vacuum

Help! I'm Living With Someone!

- Start off right: Talk about your preferences and values with each other
